### Help the Climate Bill to work its way through Parliament

Did you know that Zali Steggall, the independent Federal Member for Warringah, has introduced a Climate Change Bill into Parliament? It is currently being reviewed by the House Standing Committee on the Environment and Energy. You can track its progress, access links to your local MP and get more information [here](#).

The Bill proposes net-zero emissions by 2050, risk assessments and adaptation plans. It also proposes reviewing technologies to fast track emission reductions and establishing an independent Climate Change Commission.

The UK passed a similar Climate Act in 2008, and since this time emissions have [decreased 43% and the economy has grown by 75%](#). UK politicians agreed that climate change was bigger than any one party, and now their only difference is on speed and scale of their climate response.

The One Million Women Love Earth Festival was held on Zoom this year. Scanning through the hundreds of faces, I was pleased to see quite a few Zontians.

This was a marvellous event with attendees from around the world gathered electronically to hear climate champions such as Christiana Figueres, Mary Robinson, and Craig Reucassel. We also were moved by entertainers including Paul Kelly, Missy Higgins and Alice Skye.

The highlights are described on the [website](#) and include these wonderful words from Mary Robinson, the former President of Ireland:

***Women globally have woken up to the fact that we have to be there at the table.***

***There has to be parity of decision making. We need women to be half of the cabinet, half of the board in business. We need women to be involved at every level - we need their voices.***

***Yes, I say to all women globally, this is our time, our century and we must step up and take that responsibility... We must walk tall, take our place and make it the century where women's leadership will lead us forward.***

## All I want for Christmas ... is a sustainable world :)

Zontians have been sharing their ideas about sustainable shopping.

Eloise suggests to think about:

- **Packaging** - select items with minimal or no plastic wrapping.
- **The longevity of the product** - avoid single-use products and also ask yourself, "Is this something low value and likely to be discarded or left unused within a year?"

- **Provenance/source of the product** - is it manufactured locally? If it is not something made by club members themselves, e.g. the Zonta Club of Central Goldfield's delicious shortbread, is there an opportunity to support some of the many social enterprises that support women or migrants such as [SisterWorks](#)?

Carole believes that the best presents are those that help women and girls. She gives donations in the recipient's name to the [Zonta Foundation for Women's Endowment Fund](#) and purchases tickets to Zonta Club events. She is also trying to wrap family presents this year using re-usable fabrics such as heirloom linen, tea towels, pillowcases, and ribbons.

Sandra and Sharon noted that One Million Women has just created a [LoveEarth Marketplace](#) where you can discover brands, organisations and community groups that are providing solutions to help us all live climate action in every aspect of our lives.

Val's family and friends have been telling her about [ZeroCo](#) that reuses ocean waste products to make recycled plastic containers for re-fillable home cleaning and personal care products. They also found an app where you can track your carbon emissions, and that also offers ways to offset your carbon footprint. [Aerie](#) works by scanning your inbox for flight itineraries, train tickets, and Uber and Lyft receipts, and calculates your carbon emissions based on that information. It then presents you with the option to offset that number by purchasing credits to save trees through one of the app's verified forest conversation partners.

## TEDx Perth - Countdown WA Climate Leadership Summit

Western Australia has been in lockdown for many months and with no community spread of Covid-19, this TEDx event was held face-to-face with around 250 attendees, plus volunteers and speakers.

These are some of the highlights to look out for on [TED](#) in coming weeks:

- Jeff Hansen the Managing Director of Sea Shepherd Australia, described a 10,000 mile, 110-day chase across the oceans to successfully track down the [Thunder](#) - the world's most notorious poaching vessel.
- Brendan Hammond told us about the [Asian Renewable Energy Hub](#) planned for the Pilbara Region of WA - 6,500 square kilometres of solar and wind generation. This is renewable energy on an oil and gas production scale!
- Chantal Caruso from [Clean State](#) who describes, in 60-seconds, 26 big ideas to create 200,000 jobs in WA by transforming to a sustainable future.
- David Carter, the CEO of [Austral Fisheries](#) who described how his fishing company is the only one in the world that is certified as Carbon Neutral. It took 402 days from deciding to do it, to achieve it and he feels a failure as no other companies have followed suit.
- Anna Poelina is a first nations scientist and traditional custodian from the Kimberley. She showed an understanding of two worlds and described a future where humans were part of nature and did not dominate it. She urged everyone to 'wake up the snake' which means to wake up our consciousness.

Fiona Stanley, a Western Australian child health expert who has a hospital named after her, called for four actions: recognise first nations in the Constitution, create diverse citizens juries of young and old to understand our climate change capacity; bring net-zero forward to 2040, and to go [Beyond GDP](#) to find a more sustainable and equitable way of measuring a country's success.
