Question 1: We have been working on a mission statement for Zonta Says NOW. What do you think of this initial draft? Just a thought...(yes, good comment, I've trimmed down some of the words below)
7	A good start for the short to medium term
8	I think we also need a bullet point drawing attention to the intersection between women and the environment. 'Sustainable' is the key word there, but not prominent enough. Maybe: 'protecting our Earth' (?) (Have included 'world' to accommodate this)
9	supporting climate initiatives driven by, and/or supporting females
10	Perhaps adding - ensuring women's economic empowerment ; could also change last statement to read - inspiring more female leaders (The economics is covered in the women's rights and have included inspiring below)
11	Perfect and succinct!
12	Spot on.

Question 6: We would like to develop a set of sustainable principles that clubs could use to reduce their carbon footprint. What would you like to see included in these principles?

4	Our club meets at the local Country Club which we would like them to stop using once only drinking straws
5	Use of digital technology to reduce hard copy print materials and where suitable, travel to meetings.
6	Recycle, reuse, repair, rethink. I hadn't finished the previous question when it concluded itself! So here are MORE PRINCIPLES: Consider carbon miles in all purchases and travel (even local trips), consider 'green and sustainable investments, actively reducing energy use in the home (even by 10%), alternative birthday and Christmas gift-giving ideas (eg supporting overseas sustainable energy or food projects, endangered species programs, etc).
7	As we don't have a permanent location it would be an individual action in their own home. A bit difficult I think to calculate and evidence. Some principles could be recycling food waste either in own compost bin or into the green waste bin. Solar panels and batteries. Buy local to reduce the carbon miles of products.
8	Car pooling; no plastic or disposable cups/glasses/plates; 'green' gifts to guests; no hard copies of agendas
9	information on how to tell if a container/package is recycable

10	Eco-fashion. Buy less, but buy good quality; maintain, hand-wash, do not over wash, repair, recycle, buy second-hand but again look for quality. Eat less meat - choose a vegetarian breakfast and lunch and consider reducing evening meals with meat content.

How can we find reliable sources to educate ourselves and therefore others about current environmental issues? What organisations can we support to drive the market in a positive way? At the A1 advocacy meeting earlier this week I was talking to someone who is part of a club in Victoria that seems to be a bit anti-climate action because they think it is too political. To be honest I don't think we have much time to spend on this (better to just press on leading by example), but it sounded like they preferred to approach this issue from a 'sustainability' perspective. Honestly I think it's all the same, but it could be something to consider if we are trying to be inclusive with our language and the actions we choose to promote.
