
Population exposed to high and extreme water stress by region, current and projected



Women and Climate Change



Climate change has a greater impact on those sections of the population, in all countries, that are most reliant on natural resources for their livelihoods and/or who have the least capacity to respond to natural hazards, such as droughts, landslides, floods and hurricanes.



Women face higher risk and greater burdens



The majority of the world's poor are women



Women's unequal participation in decision-making processes



Women are sensitive to climate-driven food insecurity due to increased nutritional needs during menstruation and childbirth



Women have unequal access to resources

Women can be “game changers”

- **Gender inequality, climate vulnerability, and state fragility are strongly interlinked.**
- **Support initiatives that target women’s empowerment and promote gender equality.**
- **Gender considerations should also be fully reflected in emerging policy and programming on climate-related security risks –not only to strengthen awareness and understanding of particular vulnerabilities, but also to highlight opportunities for leadership and inclusion of women and marginalized groups in decision-making processes.**
- **More investment for gender equality and women’s empowerment is required in fragile states, including implications on human mobility, and especially in sectors related to natural resources, where it is particularly low.**
