Is climate action too slow?

COP28 in Dubai marked the conclusion of the first 'global stocktake' against the Paris Agreement. Much like this tortoise, the [UNFCCC](#) concluded that *progress was too slow across all areas of climate action - from reducing greenhouse gas emissions, to strengthening resilience, to getting the financial and technological support to vulnerable nations.* The good news was that COP28 signalled the 'beginning of the end' of the fossil fuel era.

In Australia, there is some slow, steady progress being made to reduce fossil fuel use. For example, nearly a third of our households now generate power from solar panels, we have over 130,000 [electric cars](#) on our roads, all [new homes](#) in Victoria are now gas-free and the Government is consulting on the long-awaited [fuel efficiency standards](#) - so we can expect to see more fuel efficient vehicles on our roads! However, will this progress be undone by our [expanding](#) fossil fuel industry?

COP 28 included its first ever [Health Day](#) with 40 million health professionals joining a call to action to prioritise health in climate negotiations. Health care professionals are concerned about the impacts of climate on health and the impacts of the healthcare industry on the environment.

Our guest speaker at the February meeting will be **Catelyn Richards**, a registered nurse, who established [Climate Action Nurses](#) to empower Australian and Pacific nurses to take urgent climate action for themselves, their workplaces and their communities. Catelyn was inspired to take action when she realised how intense heat was impacting people and how much waste was generated at her hospital. Catelyn is definitely not a tortoise!

Around Australia people are suffering from intense heat, bushfires and floods. In recent weeks, I have been volunteering with Red Cross Emergency Services and have visited many homes that were impacted by bushfires. People were shocked by how quickly the fire moved, with embers lighting fires two kilometres away from the fire-front. People in suburban homes never expected to be evacuated, yet they were. In the space of a few minutes, complacency was replaced by fear. The community is now recovering, but it takes mental health first aid and time to get over the shock - especially when the charred landscape is a constant reminder of what could have happened. Has your club considered hosting a [mental health first](#)

[aid](#) course to support your community? Please revisit our Disaster Management [leaflet](#) and follow the links to make sure you are disaster-ready.

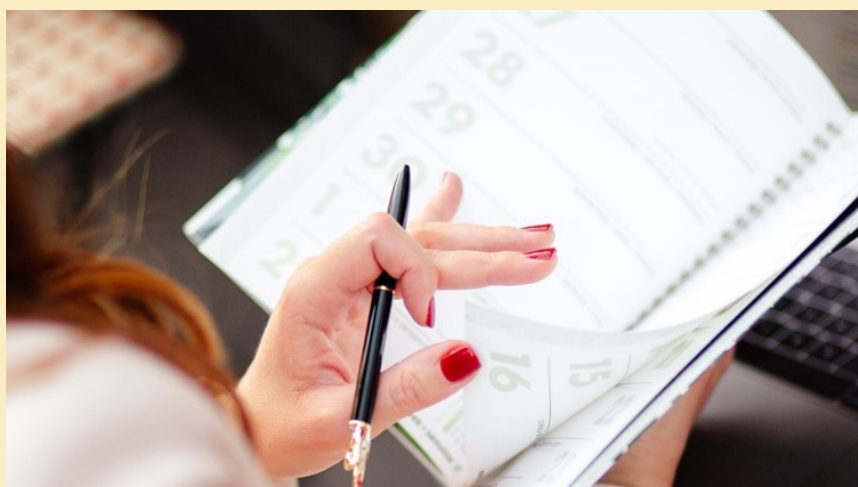
