Summit of the Future

As Antonio Guterres says, "We can't build a future for our grandchildren with a system built for our grandparents". The United Nations' *Summit of the Future* on 21-23 September in New York, aims to turbocharge global actions so we can get the Sustainable Development Goals back on track for implementation in full by 2030.

The Summit will produce a [Pact for the Future](#) based around 5 chapters:

- Sustainable development and financing for development
- International peace and security
- Science, technology and innovation and digital cooperation
- Youth and future generations

- Transforming global governance.

All chapters will address human rights, gender and sustainable development.

The UN is also finalising for the Summit a [Declaration on Future Generations](#) and a [Global Digital Compact](#) that will work towards intergenerational justice and protecting human rights online among other things.

Ideally, Zonta's advocacy should align with the information in the *Pact for the Future*. Check it out online!



Anjali Sharma - Call of Duty

Anjali Sharma is 20 years old. At 16, she became the lead litigant of [Sharma vs Environment Minister](#), a class action legal case which argued that the Environment Minister owes all young people a duty of care to protect them from the impacts of climate change. In 2021, she was successful, but following an appeal from the Minister, this ruling was overturned.

However, Anjali continued the campaign, by calling to have this duty legislated through Federal Parliament. [Anjali's actions](#) featured in the ABC's Australian Story in March 2024.

Anjali aims to raise awareness about the disproportionate impacts of climate change, particularly towards young people and people of colour.

The Zonta Says NOW team has followed Anjali's journey since the initial court case and feels privileged to hear from Anjali first-hand at the October Think Tank. Please [spread the word](#) and encourage members and guests to hear her story!

COP29 - Meet Australia's Negotiator

This year's United Nations Conference of the Parties Climate Conference (COP29) will be [hosted by Azerbaijan](#) in its capital, Baku in November. The COP will revolve around two mutually reinforcing parallel pillars. The first pillar — to “enhance ambition” — encourages all parties to commit to ambitious national plans and transparency. The second pillar — to “enable action” — reflects the critical role of finance, a key tool to turn ambition into action and reduce emissions, adapt to climate change, and address loss and damage.

Every two years countries are required to submit a Biennial Transparency Report (BTR) to show how they are meeting their Nationally Determined Contributions and encourage them to 'up' their climate ambitions. The first BTR is due in December 2024 and you can follow progress on COP 29 [here](#).

COP30 will be held in Brazil in 2025. Australia hopes to [co-host COP31](#) in 2026 with a South Pacific nation and will find out in November if they are successful.

The next event in the Women's Climate Congress' (WCC) popular [Women's Climate Conversations](#) online series, will feature **Dr Sally Box, Australia's Chief Negotiator** at the UNFCCC Conference of the Parties (COP) conferences.

Dr Janet Salisbury (who spoke at our [August Think Tank](#)) will ask Dr Box about the outlook for COP29 in Azerbaijan later this year and forward plans towards a possible Australian-Pacific COP31 in 2026. They will be joined in the conversation by WCC members Kesaya Baba (Senior Manager, COP31 Strategy and Partnerships, WWF-Australia) and Tamara Inkster-Draper (Programme Manager, International Climate Politics Hub).
