The Rocky Road of Climate Progress



Progress on climate justice has been difficult this month in Azerbaijan and Colombia.

In the annual '[family photo](#)' of government leaders at the Climate Conference of the Parties (COP 29) in Azerbaijan, it was a case of 'find the women'. At the Climate COP, speaking time and decision-making positions are routinely monopolised by men with women playing an administrative, rather than a technical role. This has to change.

[UN Women](#) points out that on the first day there were only eight women speaking out of 78 government leaders and only four leaders mentioned the impact of climate change on women. Negotiations have been gridlocked over climate finance and capacity building, leaving little time to discuss [gender equality](#) that is scheduled near the end of the COP. On the plus side, the [COP](#) has included care work in the draft outcome document on just transitions, and the need to address gender gaps in STEM and women's access to green jobs. Let's see if they are mentioned in the final version.

Next year's Climate COP will be held in Belem in Brazil, but we don't know if Australia or Turkiye will be hosting the event in 2026 as discussions have reached a standstill.

Meanwhile the Biodiversity COP 16 in Colombia had [mixed outcomes](#). Delegates agreed to establish the *Cali Fund* to share the benefits of genetic resources, and a new permanent advisory body for Indigenous people was established. However, debate was gridlocked on a new fund to finance biodiversity action and only 22 per cent of the parties had come up with new biodiversity plans showing how they will meet the goals of the [Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework](#).

What's next? In December we have the 'crunch time' final discussions on the [Global Plastics Treaty](#) in South Korea, and the [Desertification COP16](#) in Saudi Arabia. We'll keep you posted on what happens.

Have you ever considered how much plastic is used with menstrual products? The UNEP [reports](#) that single-use menstrual products such as tampons and pads can contain up to 90 percent plastic and are often individually wrapped - with around 80 percent ending up in landfill. It can take 500 years for the plastic components to break down. What are the solutions?



Women's Economic Opportunity



At the November Think Tank, we shared the newly released Fact Sheet on [Women's Economic Opportunities in the Context of Climate Change](#). This 24 page document is colourful and easy to read. It is designed to be read online as it contains many hyperlinks. If you don't understand the links between climate change and women's economic opportunity, this is the document for you!

The November Think Tank was fascinating. Speakers from Sweden and Uganda explored *How international financial architecture impacts gender-equal climate justice*.

Jennie Sinclair shared her experiences and the opportunities she creates for women through the [Swedish Ownershift Foundation](#). Her research on ownership in Sweden showed that men own twice as much as women. She explained how fathers tell their sons how to invest while mothers tell their daughters how to relate. Ownershift provides support for women to 'invest in themselves, to own their future'.

Dr Saadat Nakyejwe Kimuli is an Assoc Professor of Entrepreneurship at Makerere University Business School. In Uganda, only 16 percent of women own land independently, yet 90 percent of rural Ugandan women are agricultural workers, producing 90 percent of the country's food. Women make up 30 percent of entrepreneurs and the number is rising. Saadat explained how microloans enable women to start a business and achieve financial stability. Achieving gender parity in land and business could substantially strengthen Uganda's economy..

Hosted by Zontians from Europe and Africa this event also explored well-being economies, doughnut economics and the economic cost of gender-based violence. Missed the event? See the [video](#) and [slides](#).


