The global pushback on gender equality and climate action means that, like this goat, we are heading into unknown territory. In New York, at the Commission on the Status of Women's annual meeting (CSW69), UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres declared the

'poison of patriarchy is back, and back with a vengeance ...but the antidote is action. Now is the time for us who care about equality for women and girls to stand up and speak out.'

But what can we do? This Update shares some ideas for action!

- At our Australian Think Tank in April, we learned how women are leading the way in conservation - and with 2,245 Australian plants, animals and

ecosystems threatened with extinction, we need everyone's actions to protect habitat now. I also provided a summary of my experience of attending CSW in New York.

- Last week, Zonta International launched *Elevate Equality on Earth Day* with more practical actions that we can take individually, in our clubs and in our communities. I can't wait to see the 2025 Collection from the Virtual Art Gallery on Earth Day.
- Our allies have also been busy and I encourage you to support the activities of these 'like-minded' organisations. When we collaborate, we are all stronger!

We have a Federal Election coming up on 3 May, so it is up to us to find out where our candidates stand on gender equality and climate action issues so that we can make an informed vote - and, like the goat, choose the landing we want to have.

April Conservation Conversation



What a fascinating conversation we had at the April Think Tank with Associate Professor Carly Cook who is the Head of the Conservation Management Research Group at Monash University. She explained that conservation science is dominated by women - and globally about 37 [per cent](#) of remaining natural lands are managed by indigenous people.

Australia is rapidly losing habitat for thousands of threatened species and in 2024 the koala had more habitat approved for destruction than any other threatened species. (See [Extinction Wrapped](#), page 5). In 2020, Professor Graeme Samuel completed an independent review of the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act* (EPBC Act) - that attracted over

30,000 submissions. Sadly, the government has not implemented its recommendations.

Carly talked about protecting nature wherever it occurs and sometimes this can include cemeteries, roadside reserves and surfing reserves. Carly described the problems associated with converting state forest - where people can ride horses, go trailbike riding and cut firewood - to national park where natural resources must be carefully managed and where human activities are limited.

Parliamentarians like to paint a picture of a false dichotomy: jobs or environment. Carly explained that we can have both!

What can we do? Advocate at every level of government to protect the natural habitat of endangered species and ask our local MPs where they stand on improving protections through the EPBC Act. If you missed the meeting, check out the video, slides and reports using the link below.

- [Check](#) that our community's disaster and preparedness response plans adequately address the needs of women and girls.

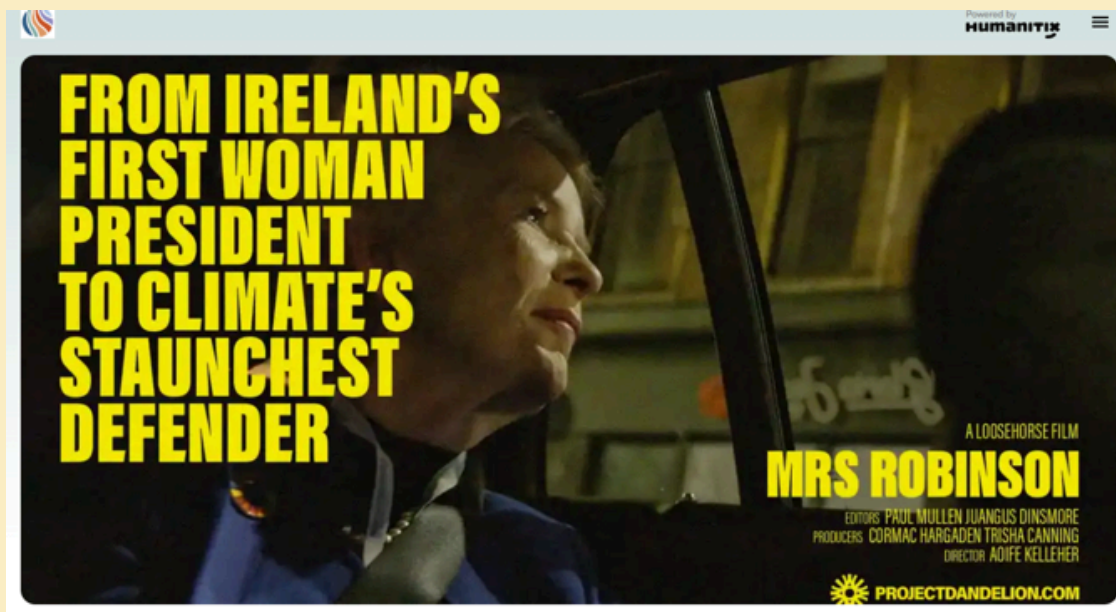
- [Engage](#) our local media by sending an op-ed or letter to the editor highlighting the key facts and information about how 22 April is a day for women's rights.

Turbulent Travel? Offset it with Purpose



Climate change is fuelling extreme weather—and chaotic travel. On my recent trip from Perth to New York for CSW69, I spent 48 hours flying and 68 hours delayed by dust storms and tornado warnings.

To prepare for the trip, I made changes. I switched to an electric vehicle powered by home solar, buy local seasonal food, fly economy on modern aircraft, and try to make purchases that meet my *needs*, not *wants*. And while I can't avoid flying altogether, I offset my air travel by supporting the Zonta Foundation for Women.

In our [Zonta Says NOW Guide to Responsible Air Travel](#), we shared how we can offset emissions using the Gold Standard for the Global Goals, which certifies carbon credits that reduce greenhouse gases *and* support at least three Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Here's the lightbulb moment.

Zonta may not issue carbon credits, but by implementing [Zonta International's Statement on Climate Change](#), we're doing the work—advocating for emission reductions and empowering women and girls worldwide.

Zonta's programs contribute to nearly all 17 SDGs. Yes, we champion Gender Equality (SDG5) and Climate Action (SDG13). But we also educate, help end

poverty and hunger, improve health and sanitation, and foster sustainable economic growth.

So next time you book a flight, consider this.
